

What is it?

Reducing Costs.

Affordability Counts was established by FIU Online as a direct response to the increasing costs of textbooks in higher education. The program recognizes faculty who have taken steps to change their courses in an effort to advance affordability. We are now expanding Affordability Counts to include other Florida state colleges and universities.

How does it work?

- 1.** Faculty take steps to convert a current course into an affordable course by implementing low-cost materials. Materials can be sources from already listed medallion-awarded courses.
- 2.** Faculty submits a course with materials costing students no more than \$20 in total out-of-pocket expenses per credit.
- 3.** A committee reviews the course and confirms the target price. If the course passes, faculty receives an 'Affordability Counts' medallion to display on their courses and are added to the low-cost course listing on our website.
